Le retour des femmes sur le marché du travail dans les premiers mois de vie du nourrisson et l'anxiété de séparation

Gabrielle Garon-Carrier, Ph. D.

Gabrielle Garon-Carrier's work is grounded into longitudinal research and emphasizes the child and family-wide factors predicting the attainment of developmental milestones.

Her research also advances knowledge on the impact of social policies for families with young children. Since 2020, she holds a Tier 2 Canada Research Chair in child early learning and social adjustment.

Evidence suggest that the maternal workforce and household income status may lead to heightened child separation anxiety symptoms during early childhood. Early employment could threaten secure mother-child attachment by reducing access to the primary caregiver, increasing the risk for the development of separation anxiety.

From an economic perspective securing employment is one effective strategy to ensure child well-being. Using a population-based sample, we examined whether maternal workforce and household income status at 5-month postpartum was prospectively associated with separation anxiety symptoms. This communication will highlight key findings from this research.
